1. Introduction.

We're glad to tell 2011 was a good year for the studbook *Hyla savignyi*. There were much more breedings and were much smaller compared to 2010. Also there were contacts with English breeders, who also have *Hyla savignyi* from Cyprus; just like the frogs the studbook breeds with. We transferred some of our *Hyla savignyi* to them and hope the English breeders will join us at any time.

2. Studbook population:

At december 31th 2011 the studbook contains 404 living animals. This is much more than the studbook needs. It is our purpose to keep 104 of them within the studbook on 5 locations. The rest will be transferred.

3. Locations:

At december 31th 2011 there are 5 locations where animals are kept. These are the same locations as the years before.

4. Births:

In 2011 again there is a number of eggs laid; this time at only two locations. At december 31th there were at least 320 living frogs at two locations.

5. Imports

In 2008 there were no imports of *Hyla savignyi*.

6. Deaths.

In 2011 there were 18 deaths.

7. Transfers:

In 2010 there were no transfers.

8. More information about locations:

Location A:

At the end of 2011 group A contained 28 frogs. One of them died. 9 frogs moved from location D to location A. Also there were 300 new-bred froglets. 6 of them are still living on location A. The others no longer exist within the studbook. But 30 of them are sold to people who have serious plans of breeding them further and it is possible they will join the studbook.

At the end of 2010 location A contains 42 frogs..

Location B:

In 2010 the location B contains 30 frogs. 10 of them died and 10 are given away and no longer exist within the studbook. At the end of 2011 Location B consists of 10 frogs.

Location C:

At the end of 2010 location C consists of 15 frogs.

There were 5 deaths. There were no breedings.

At the end of 2011 there location C consists of 10 frogs.

Location D:

At the end of 2010 there are 40 frogs on location D. 9 of them moved to location A. There were 100 new-bred frogs. 9 of them will stay at location D. At the end of 2011 location D consists of 40 frogs.

Location E.

At the end of 2010 there were 5 frogs on location E.

There was one death. There was no breeding. There were no frogs received or moved.

At the end of 2011 there were 4 frogs on location E.
