1. Introduction

This is the latest report on the Armadillo Lizard population registered with the European Studbook Foundation.

2. Studbook Population

As at February 2015 the total studbook population is 75 specimens (24.20.31) of this, only 32 (13.12.7) are currently still living.

3. Locations

As far as the studbook is aware, this species is kept at 9 different locations throughout Europe. The only zoological establishment to have registered their animals within the studbook is Leipzig Zoo in Germany where they house 1.1 animals. There are a further 2.0 and 3.3 at private locations in Germany. The remaining animals within the studbook are housed at private locations throughout the European Union. 1.1 individuals are housed at a private location in Belgium, 2.3.3 animals are housed in Sweden, 3.3 and 1.1 (still to be officially logged) are housed in the Netherlands and a further 0.0.4 animals by a private individual in France.

4. Births

No births have been reported within the last 12 months.

5. Imports

No imports have been reported.

6. Deaths

It is with great sadness that I must report that we lost 7 animals housed at the location in France. At this time we are unsure on what animal have passed away and for the purposes of this report have been recorded as unknown sex.

7. Transfers / Additions

Since the last report 1.1 individuals have been added to the studbook – as yet these have not been logged but it is understood that they will be shortly.

8. Discussion Points
